William Hudnut, an expert on regional issues, will present
“Working Together Sure Beats Competing Separately” at a free public presentation in
Boise

Willam Hudnut, a Senior Resident Fellow at the Urban Land Institute, will be in Boise on May 17 to present “*Working Together Sure Beats Competing Separately*” at the Idaho Historical Museum at 7:00 pm. Mr. Hudnut is involved with regional issues across the nation and is best known for his 16-year tenure as Mayor of Indianapolis, where he led the public-private partnership that generated a dramatic revitalization of that city. He also served as a Congressman, clergyman, and author. He wrote *Halfway to Everywhere*, a lively first-hand report on how America’s older suburbs are faring, and *Cities on the Rebound: A Vision for Urban America*, which explores his vision for dealing with diversity, encouraging sustainable development, finding alternatives to sprawl, managing technological change, persuading cities and suburbs to collaborate, improving government efficiency, and urging citizens to participate as advocates, rather than adversaries.
